

Add Saskatchewan Polytechnic to Google Scholar for better access to the full article.





How to add “Find it @SaskPolytech” to Google Scholar search results


1. Click the menu (the three lines).



2. Choose “Settings.”




3. Select "Library links."




4. Search for Saskatchewan Polytechnic.
