




Add Full-Text Results to Google Scholar

This feature requires a Google account. When enabled, you can access full-text articles provided by the Saskatchewan Polytechnic Library when you're using Google Scholar.

Step 1: Log in to your Google account.

Step 2: From Google Scholar's home page (<https://scholar.google.ca>), click the Menu icon ☰ in the upper left-hand corner and chose **Settings**.

Step 3: Select **Library links**:



Step 4: In the box type Saskatchewan Polytechnic and click the search button:
